Biography

Maj Jennifer S. Crum is a B-2 Pilot and a T-38A Evaluator Pilot for the 393rd Bomb Squadron, Whiteman AFB, Missouri. She also serves as an Assistant Director of Operations for the squadron's Combat Plans branch, responsible for all nuclear long-range planning and training to ensure continuous B-2 readiness for 43 Combat Mission Ready Pilots. Maj Crum was selected as a direct hire into the B-2 program, where she is ready to execute global strike missions for Joint Chiefs of Staff taskings.

Prior to attending Specialized Undergraduate Pilot Training at Columbus Air Force Base, Maj Crum served as an intelligence officer for the 608th Air Operations Center at Barksdale AFB and for the 93rd Intelligence Squadron at the National Security Agency, San Antonio, Texas. Maj Crum grew up in Burrton, Kansas and graduated from the United States Air Force Academy in 2011.

Amelia Earhart Hangar Museum Dinner and Evening Event



The new Amelia Earhart Hangar Museum, located at the Amelia Earhart Memorial Airport (K59), is a popular destination for pilots and aviation enthusiasts.

Recent construction (2019) of the Museum's 17,000 square-foot hangar facility included a renovated terminal, pilot's lounge and community gathering space. The facility's Art Deco design motifs are reminiscent of Earhart's lifetime in the 1920s and 1930s; one of the most innovative periods in aviation history.

The centerpiece of the museum is *Muriel*, the world's last remaining Lockheed Electra 10-E aircraft, identical to the plane Amelia piloted on her fateful round-the-world flight. Named after Amelia Earhart's younger sister, Grace Muriel Earhart Morrissey, *Muriel* is one of only 14 Lockheed Electra 10-E aircrafts ever made. Like Amelia, *Muriel* lived an adventurous life before the historic aircraft's celebrated arrival in Earhart's Atchison, Kansas, hometown.

Surrounding *Muriel* are 14 interactive STEM and history storytelling exhibit areas that take visitors through Earhart's extraordinary life, from growing up in Atchison, Kansas, to the height of her worldwide fame as the first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic Ocean.
